## Admission requirements

- A completed first-cycle two-subject study programme in the same disciplines; or
- any completed first-cycle study programme in another field, if prior to enrolment the candidate has completed course units essential for second-cycle studies; these are determined with reference to how different the professional field is and consist of 10–60 credits; or
- a completed professional higher education programme (under the former programme), if prior to enrolment the candidate has completed course units essential for second-cycle studies; these are determined with reference to how different the field is, and consist of 10 to 60 credits.

## Learning outcomes

The qualification holder will be able to:

- go beyond a Eurocentric understanding of the world,
- work autonomously in a Slovene-Japanese interlingual and intercultural environment,
- demonstrate passive and, to a lesser extent, active knowledge of characters, vocabulary and grammatical patterns at approximately the level of the stage 1 standard examination in Japanese as a foreign language (Nihongo nouryoku siken 1 kyu), i.e. use around 10,000 of the most common words (of which around 50% actively) and around 2,000 characters used to write these words (of which around 1,200 actively), and all basic grammatical structures and patterns of modern Japanese,
- demonstrate in-depth knowledge of and apply the principles of using suitable forms of Japanese in various social contexts,
- demonstrate in-depth understanding of texts in modern language on general social and popular science topics,
- translate more complex texts from Japanese into Slovene,
- undertake interlingual mediation and, in the event of having completed course units in a relevant subject, consecutive interpreting between Slovene and Japanese,
- use ICT in connection with Japanese: computer processing of texts, internet, electronic dictionaries,
- demonstrate knowledge of the basics of teaching Japanese as a starting point for a later teaching specialisation (in the event of having completed course units in a relevant subject),
- demonstrate knowledge of the principal characteristics of the structure of Japanese society and the principal characteristics of Japanese culture and tradition via analysis of systematically selected media and specialist texts.

## **Assessment and completion**

Examination performance is graded as follows: 10 (excellent); 9 (very good: above-average knowledge but with some mistakes); 8 (very good: solid results); 7 (good); 6 (adequate: knowledge satisfies minimum criteria); 5-1 (inadequate). In order to pass an examination, a candidate must achieve a grade between adequate (6) and excellent (10).

## **Progression**

In order to progress to the second year of the programme, students must have completed course units totalling 90% of the credits prescribed by the curriculum for the individual year (i.e. 54 out of 60 credits).

## **Transitions**

Third-cycle doctoral study programmes (SQF level 10)

## **Condition for obtaining certificate**

In order to complete the programme, students must complete all course units prescribed by the study programme and individual subject syllabuses, for a total of 60 credits. Since this is a two-subject study programme, in order to complete the overall programme students must also complete all course units in the other discipline, amounting to 60 credits, for a total of 120 credits.
