Learning outcomes

- recognise convincing strategies that do not hold to philosophical rigorousness,
- consider other positions and appropriately modify one's own,
- get to grips with everyday issues: through reflection, analysis, seeking hidden assumptions and overlooked implications and so forth,
- analyse the everyday experiencing of the world and use this as a starting point for philosophical reflection,
- encourage, conduct and steer philosophical debate and thinking,
- help students master basic philosophical concepts and categories,
- develop in children the elements of critical and philosophical thinking.

Assessment and completion

Examination performance is scored as follows: 10 (excellent); 9 (very good: above-average knowledge but with some mistakes); 8 (very good: solid results); 7 (good); 6 (adequate: knowledge satisfies minimum criteria); 5-1 (inadequate). In order to pass an examination, a candidate must achieve a grade between adequate (6) and excellent (10).

Progression

To progress to the second year, students must have at least 25 ECTS credits in the proposed study programme and an adequate number of ECTS credits envisaged in the other study programme.

Transitions

Third-cycle doctoral study programmes (SQF level 10)

Condition for obtaining certificate

Students complete a two-subject study programme when they have completed all requirements of both parts of the two-subject study programme and thus accumulated at least 120 ECTS credits (60 credits in each part of the two-subject study programme).
